In the run-up to the 2024 General Election, both major parties have pledged to make the UK a life science superpower. How they plan to do this differs, but one thing is for certain, the 2024 General Election may be **the** Life Science Election.

MedTech & Pharmaceuticals

Both the medical technology and pharmaceutical sectors are essential to the provision of an efficient and high functioning NHS, and make significant contributions to the local and national economies. According to the ABPI, the British pharmaceutical industry generated £46.7 billion in turnover in 2021/22, with the MedTech industry having a combined turnover of £34.3 billion according to the ABHI.

The vast majority of innovation activity in both pharmaceuticals and medical technology remains in the traditional economic hubs of the UK, sitting within the nation's largest cities and research hubs in London, Manchester, Cambridge and Oxford.

However, with footprints in Northern Ireland, Scotland, Wales and the North East of England, the importance of both sectors to long term economic growth, and the subsequent importance in the upcoming election, is clear.

As can be seen on page 8, and due to the heavy dominance of urban environments in the innovation clusters shared by both MedTech and pharma, the Labour Party are on for a landslide victory.

Of the 167 constituencies covering both MedTech & Pharma innovation activity, 138 (83%) are predicted to be won by the Labour Party.

The Liberal Democrats are in second place, with 11 seats (7%).



Pharmaceuticals

The pharmaceutical industry is of critical importance to the UK economy. According to the Association of the British Pharmaceutical Industry (ABPI), the industry contributes £16.4bn of economic value to the UK economy, with 126,000 employed in high-skilled jobs across the industry.

The vast majority of pharmaceutical innovation activity matches that of the medical technology sector. However, here are a number of areas unique to pharmaceutical activity.

Broadly, the North East of England has a strong pharmaceutical footprint, unique from MedTech activity. Whilst MedTech activity is evident in the area's traditional economic hub, Newcastle, the pharmaceutical industry's is more expansive, reaching areas such as Sunderland, Durham and Darlington.

Kent is another area with strong pharmaceutical sector, with the constituencies of Canterbury, East Thanet, Dover and Deal, and Herne Bay and Sandwich noted by the Department of Science Innovation and Technology as producing £115 million of pharmaceutical turnover.

Of the 36 constituencies containing clusters of pharmaceutical innovation activity, all but 4 are predicted to be won by the Labour Party in the upcoming election, an 89% win rate.

The Conservative Party are only predicted to win one of the 36 available seats, with the Lib Dems predicted to claim 4 (9%).

Medical Technology

There are 4,465 HealthTech companies in the UK, with a combined turnover of £34.3bn. Employing over 154,000 people across the country, the industry develops technologies that diagnose, treat and improve a person's health and wellbeing.

Medical technology includes everything from simple bandages, to life-saving blood tests and robots that can perform highly complex surgeries.

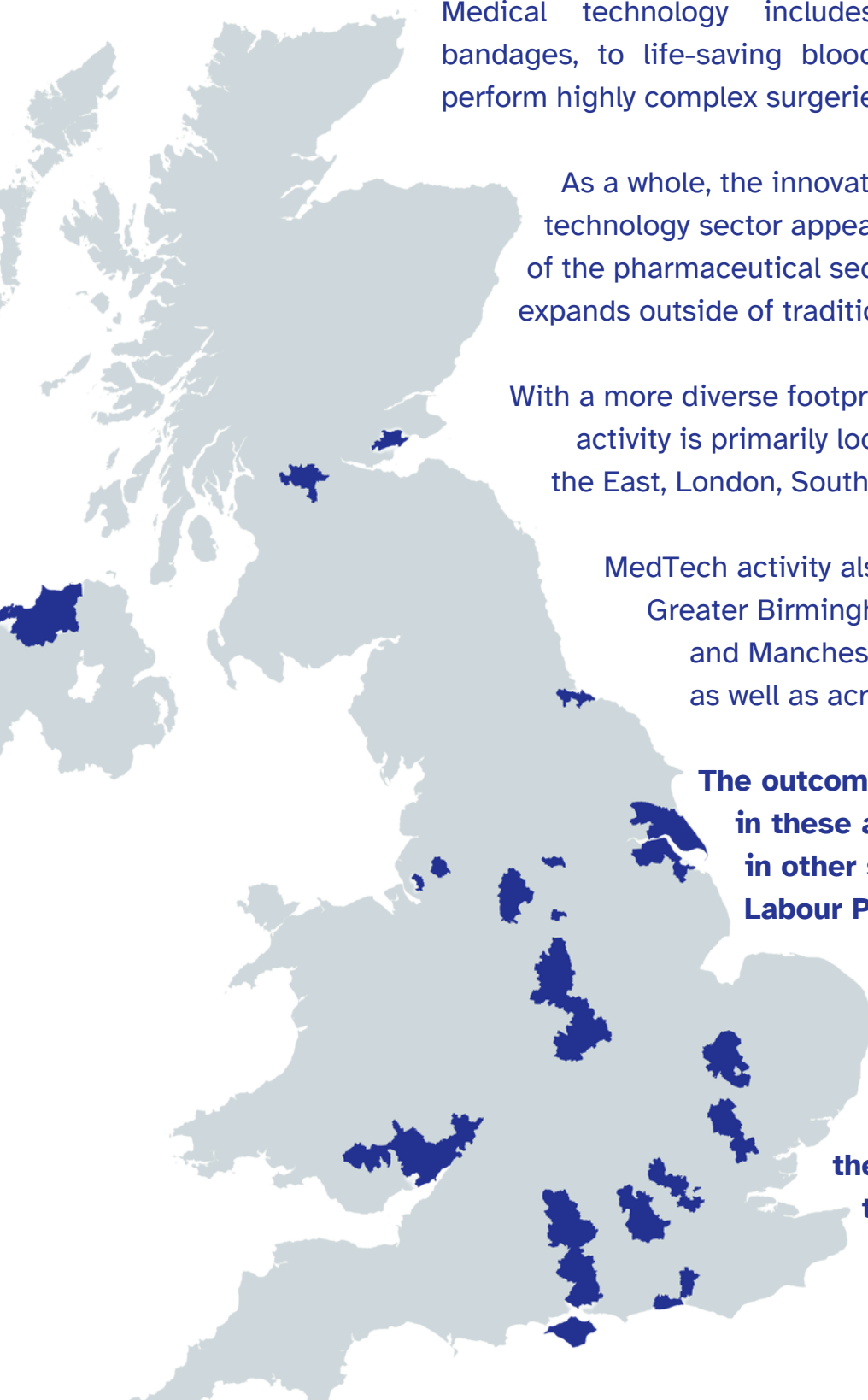
As a whole, the innovation activity of the medical technology sector appears to expand further than that of the pharmaceutical sector, in the sense that it expands outside of traditional economic hubs.

With a more diverse footprint in England, MedTech activity is primarily located in the North, Midlands, the East, London, South East and South West.

MedTech activity also expands further across Greater Birmingham, Hampshire, Humber and Manchester than the pharma sector, as well as across Greater London.

The outcomes for the political parties in these areas is more mixed than in other sector clusters, with the Labour Party slightly less dominant.

Of the 80 constituencies of MedTech innovation activity, 64 (80%) are predicted to be won by the Labour Party, with 8 by the Conservatives & Liberal Democrats.
